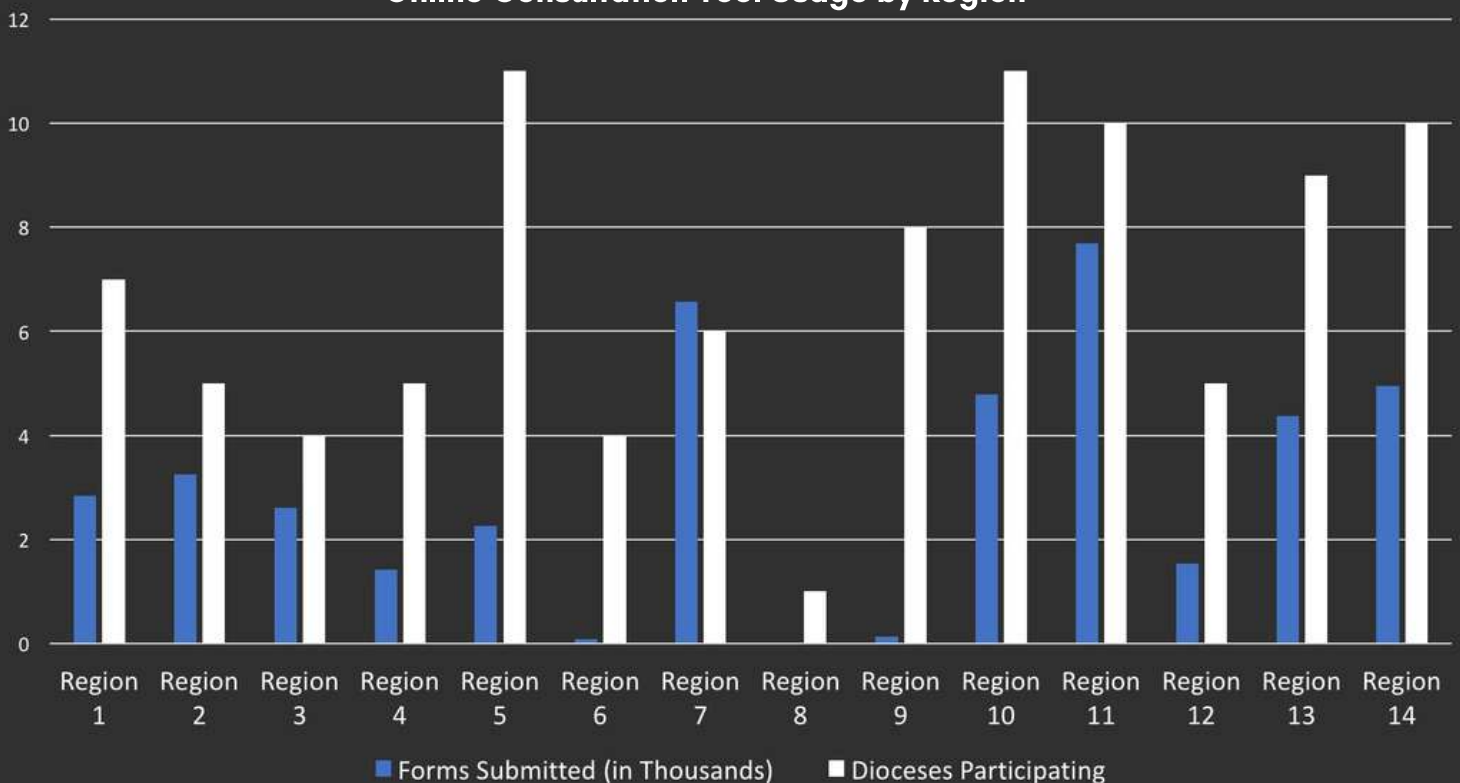

### Online Consultation Tool

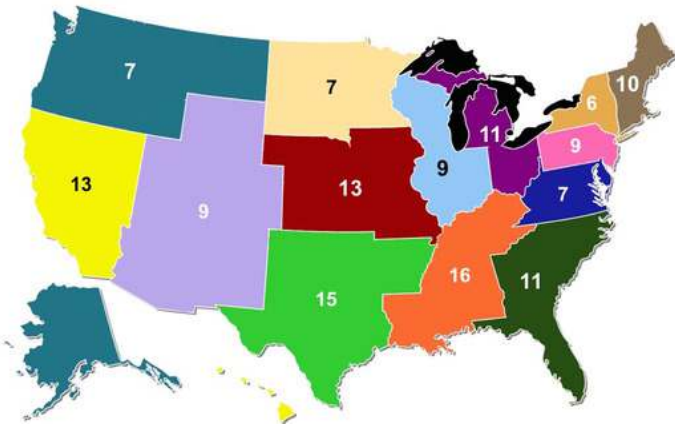
- In total, 42,144 forms have been submitted, including 4,889 from one standout diocese
- On average, dioceses have submitted about 450 consultation forms each, and the median is 110

### Staffing in Dioceses and Parishes

- Diocesan Pastoral Staff: 35 added and 14 lost
- 52 dedicating more time to Hispanic Ministry
- Diocesan Support Staff 21 added and 3 lost
- 52 dedicating more time to Hispanic Ministry
- Paid Pastoral Staff in Parishes: 30 added

- Homeless People: 34
- Civic & Professional Leaders: 28
- LGBTQ Community: 12
- Gang Members: 8

- Major improvements seen in the attitudes and concern for Hispanic Catholics
- New pastoral initiatives are evolving, especially through collaboration with other diocesan offices
