Note: If exact numbers are not available, give the best estimate at hand and highlight it **in yellow** when it is just an estimate. For example, some schools don't track the race/ethnicity of their students, so it may be necessary to contact the Superintendent or even individual school principals and get their best estimates. For the Mass attendance numbers, the total sum of the averages for each of the Masses is required. For example, the following is a hypothetical list of the Masses in Spanish in a diocese, and their average attendance:

Our Lady of Guadalupe	3 weekly Spanish Masses, averaging 325, 180, and 410 people each week
San Toribio de Mogrovejo	4 weekly Spanish Masses, averaging 220, 165, 240, and 210 people
Santo Niño Mission	1 monthly Spanish Mass, averaging 150 people
St. Anthony	1 weekly Spanish Mass, averaging 400 people
San Martín de Porres Mission	1 monthly Spanish Mass, averaging 225 people
St. Elizabeth Seton	1 weekly Spanish Mass, averaging 475 people
Immaculate Conception	2 weekly Spanish Masses, averaging 175 and 215 people

These numbers would be summarized as follows:

3,015 at **11** weekly Masses in Spanish
375 at **2** monthly Masses in Spanish
