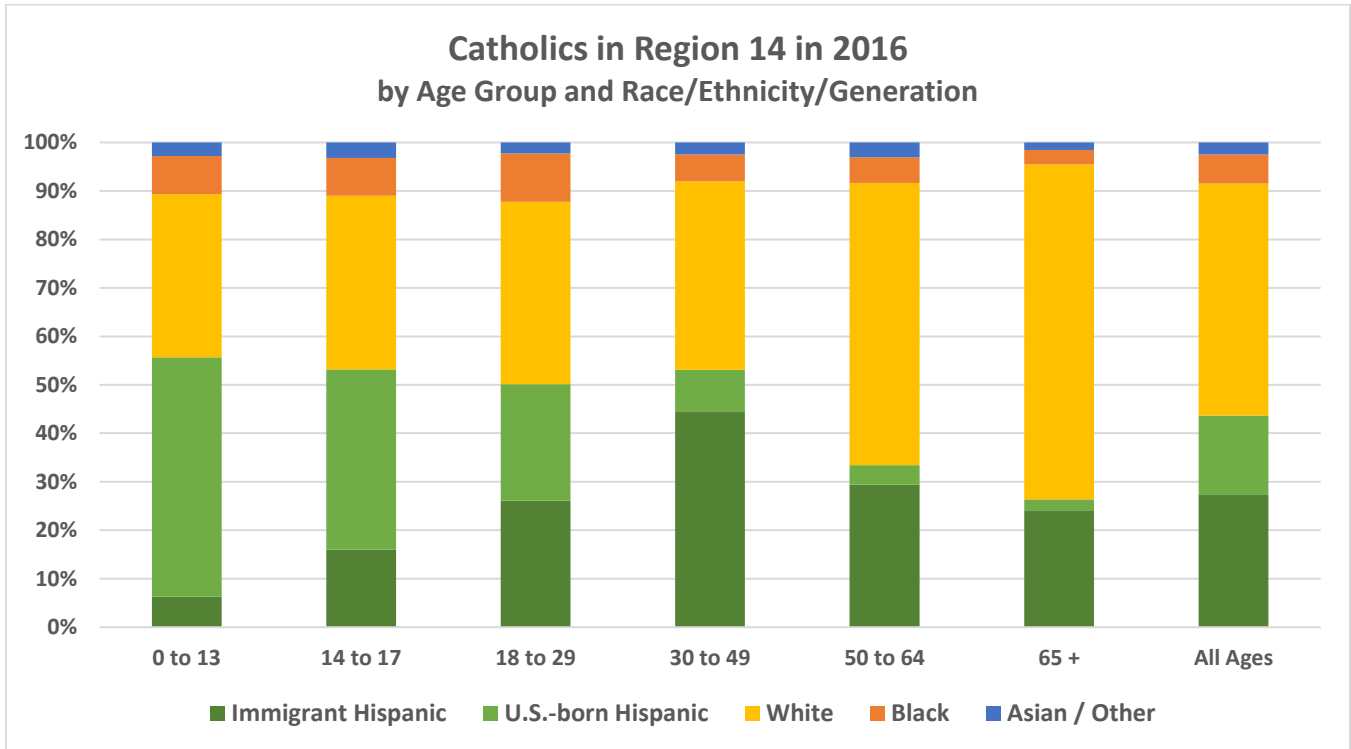

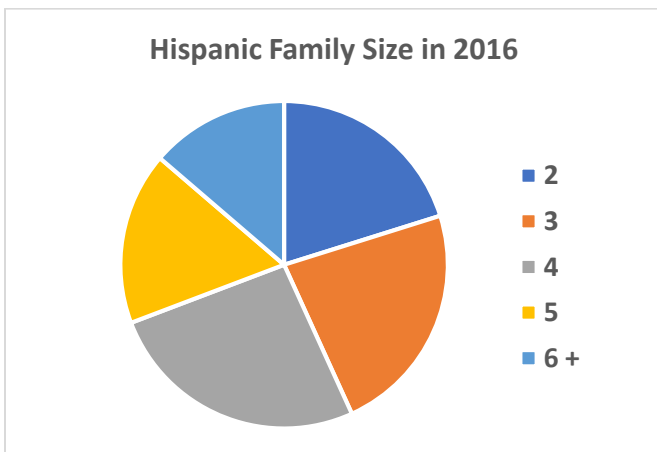

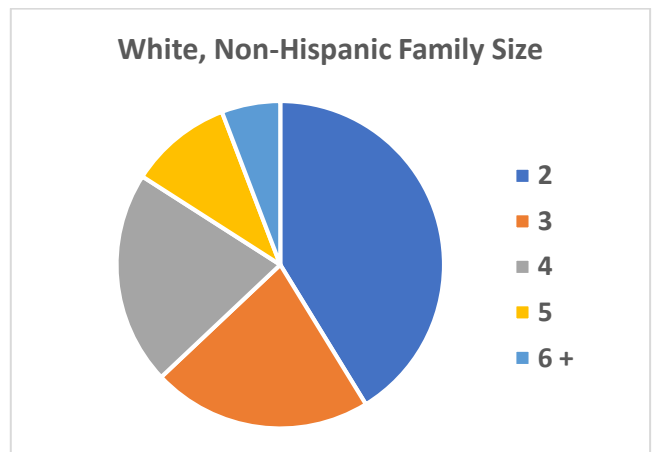


Median Hispanic Household Income: **\$50,000**

Median White Household Income: **\$69,500**

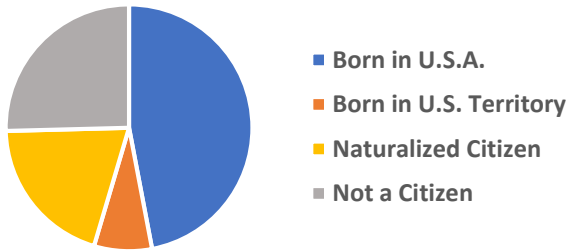

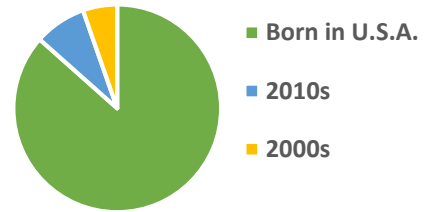

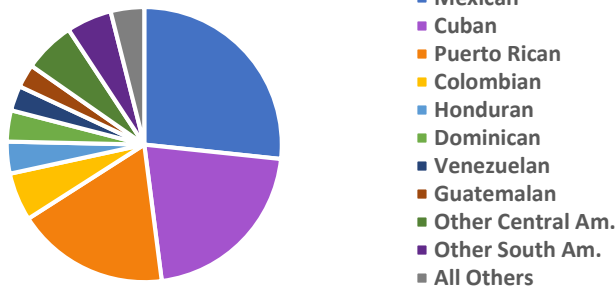
Citizenship of Hispanic Residents in 2016



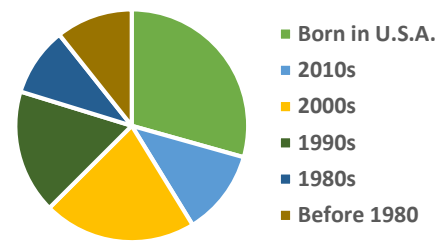
Decade of Entry for Hispanic Children



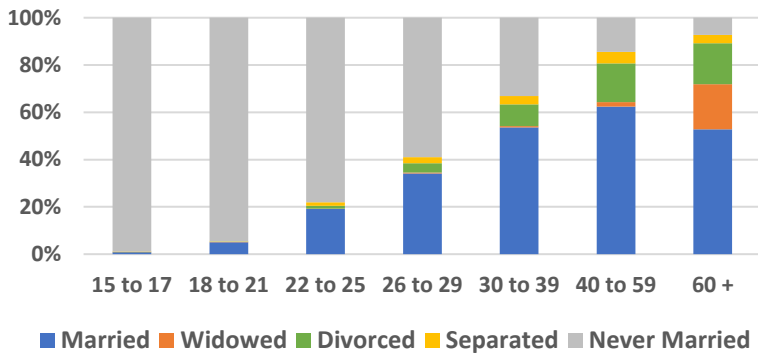
National Heritage of Hispanic Residents in 2016



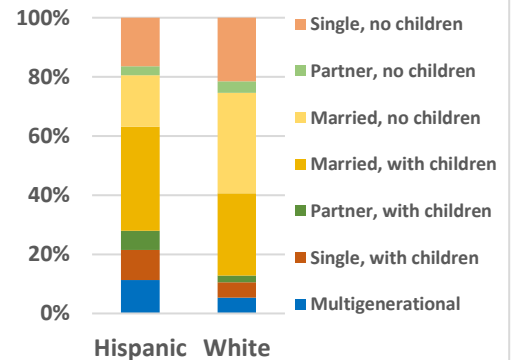
Decade of Entry for Hispanic Adults



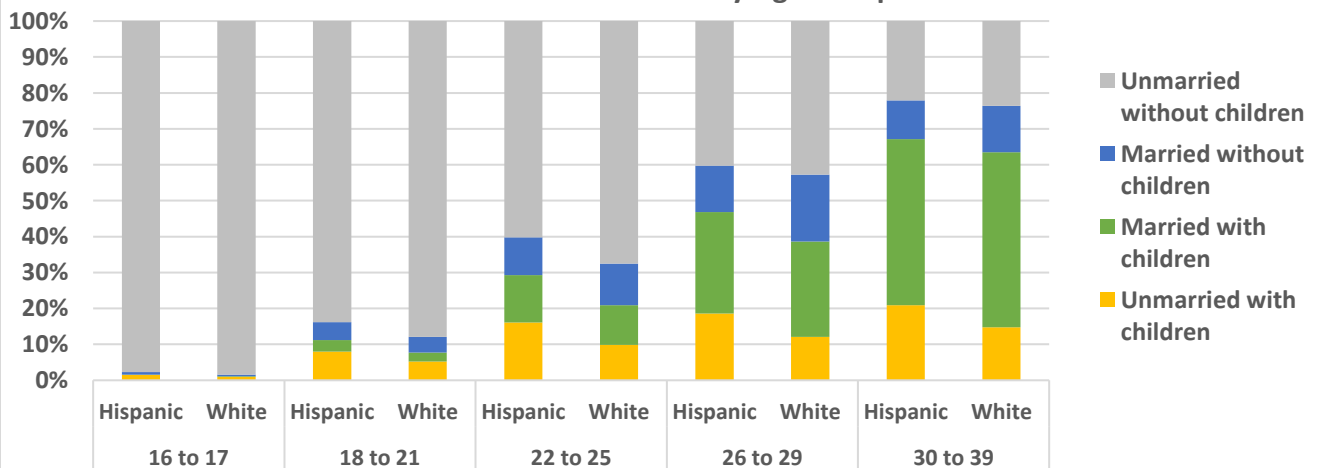
Hispanic Marital Status by Age in 2016



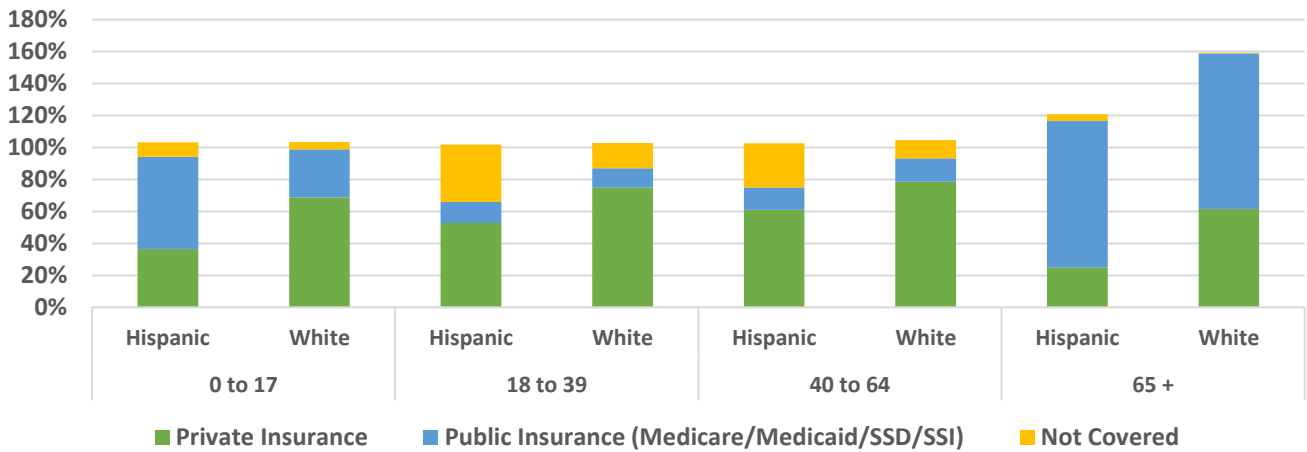
Household Type, 2012 to 2015



Marital and Parental Status of Women by Age Group from 2012 to 2015

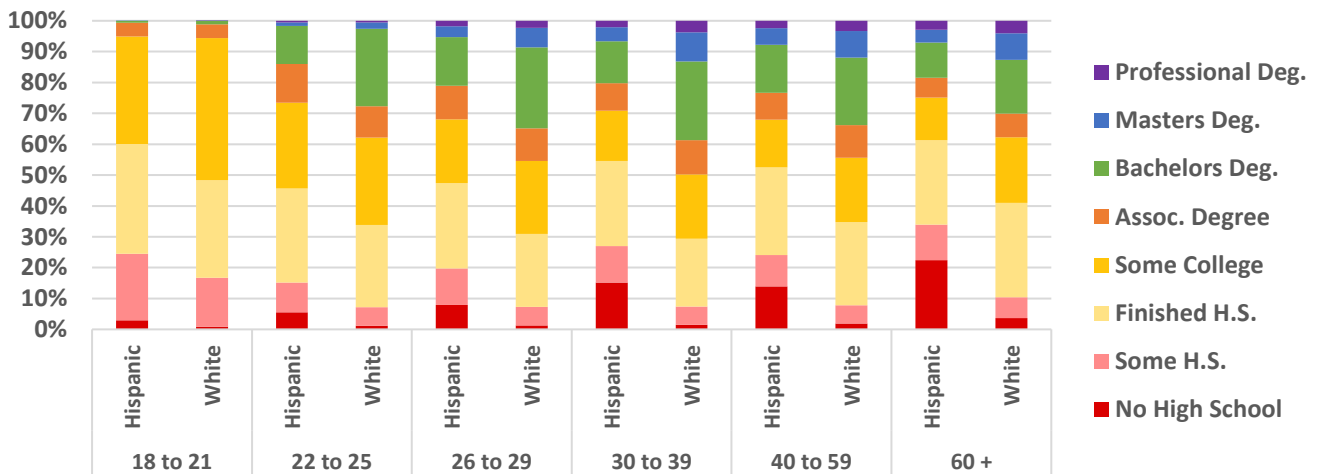


Health Insurance Coverage by Age Group in 2016*
